

MACHINE QUILTING

"Machine Quilting - You Can Do It!" Is a process class designed to acquaint you with the mechanics of machine quilting - from straight line, in-the-ditch, to free motion quilting on your own machine. Beverly will also pass along her "trick of the trade". You will learn techniques to complete your own projects and have great reference examples.

SUPPLY LIST

Sewing Machine, cleaned and in working order **Don't forget power cord & foot control**

#12 machine needles, I like Microtex Sharp

Any attachments your machine might have, and the instruction book

Walking Foot

Free Motion Foot, might be called a Darning Foot

Straight Stitch Throat Plate if you have one

Thread: 1 spool regular sewing thread

1 spool quilting thread

1 spool nylon quilting thread (size .004)

2 full bobbins, regular sewing thread

12 squares of muslin, cut 12" square (any solid would do)

1 12" pieced block that you never found a use for (not your favorite)

1 12" square of a large print, could be floral, animal, geometric or whatever

Batting; 7 pieces cut into 12" squares (you will have greater success with 100% cotton or cotton/poly)

Basic sewing supplies

Marking pencil

35 to 40 safety pins for pin basting (size 0 or 1)

Kwik Klip for closing safety pins

Rubber gloves

This is a technique class; you will learn several new ideas but do not expect to put them together into one finished project.
